MOZART: THE MAGIC FLUTE OVERTURE CLARINET CONCERTO REQUIEM

From the brimstone-licked *Dies Irae* of his unfinished *Requiem*, through the countervailing balm of the serene *Adagio* at the heart of the *Clarinet Concerto* to the frolicking fugal exuberance of the *Overture to The Magic Flute*, we open our season with a musical snapshot capturing three very different faces of Mozart taken in the last months of his life. The Bristol Ensemble joins a distinguished quartet of soloists, while to perform the concerto, step forward 'Britain's favourite clarinetist' (*The Times*) – Emma Johnson 'spontaneous in her expressiveness' (*Gramophone*).

J S BACH: A CHRISTMAS ORATORIO PARTS 1, 2, 3, AND 6

Bach's six-part Nativity-to-Epiphany 'Oratorium Tempore Nativitatis Christi' must rank as one of the most exuberant Christmas presents ever unwrapped — a sacred seasonal stocking stuffed with spinetingling choruses, heartfelt arias and bewitching story-telling — topped and tailed by some of the most jubilant music Bach was to pen. After their B minor Mass with us in 2008, returning alongside Sebastian Field ('Ravishing' The Independent), the role of the Evangelist is sung by one of the greatest Evangelists of our time, the incomparable Mark Padmore. 'Padmore's great gift... is to sing from the soul' says The Evening Standard; 'Mark Padmore is just about the finest Bach tenor in the business' (Sunday Telegraph).

FAURÉ: REQUIEM BERLIOZ: TÈ DEUM

Over 900 performers took part in the premiere of Berlioz' lavishly-scored, organ-rich, chorally-supersized setting of the *Te Deum*, a majestic, at times elemental hymn writ large to 'the eternal hopes and fears of the human race'. Its first performance provoked wild enthusiasm and 'tears that flowed like a river'. Tonight's performance is writ larger than usual, including two movements often omitted, and for the ringing tenor 'Te ergo quaesumus' we welcome Paul Charles Clarke – recently an ardent Alfred for Welsh National Opera's *Fledermaus*. Cementing the French connection is Fauré's altogether more intimate and reassuring *Requiem* – a 'lullaby of death' discharged in the reposeful resignation of the beguiling *In Paradisum*.

In our second brush with Handel this season, the period instruments of the Corelli Orchestra regroup for an oratorio second only in popularity to *Messiah* in the 19th century. Accustomed to arias conjuring intimations of the operatic stage, Handel's own contemporaries were slower to be persuaded of the virtues of *Israel in Egypt*, a work brimming with vivid choruses. But then choruses are what this retelling of the Exodus story is all about – plagues of frogs and hailstones grist to the mill of Part One's almost-exclusively-choral rollercoaster.

Apprentices

Bristol Choral Society encourages the next generation of singers and welcomes students in School Year 9 (or above) to the **Choral Apprenticeship Scheme.**

To join the scheme applicants simply need to enjoy singing, and be willing to commit to free membership of the choir for at least one year. Sight-reading and knowledge of music theory are not essential and each successful applicant will be assigned a mentor of the same voice part who will offer support at rehearsals and concerts. The scheme is entirely free of all costs.

In addition to the Apprenticeship Scheme for teenagers, we also have ongoing outreach work in some of Bristol's primary schools and have been joined by three Bristol schools as 'attached choirs' for recent concerts.
