The Course

This one day course is for anyone who leads a singing group from a conductor of a large scale choral society to a primary school class teacher. The course will have two different levels.

The **Starter** level is for those who have little or no experience and wish to build confidence in basic skills and techniques.

The **Ongoing** level is for those who have some experience and wish to develop their conducting.

Choirs will be on hand for the delegates to work with and the course will end with a concert during which selected delegates will have the opportunity to conduct. Observer places are available for those who wish to experience the event without the 'hands-on' element. You will have the opportunity to conduct music chosen from a list provided in advance.

Background Notes

Keith Orrell is the Director of the William Byrd Singers of Manchester and the Liverpool Welsh Choral. He was Chorus Master of the Hallé Choir in Manchester for seven years, and has acted as a guest Chorus Master for other symphony choruses in the UK, including the BBC Symphony Chorus. He directed the Beaumaris Singers until 2004 and more recently worked as Director of Music at Liverpool's Metropolitan Cathedral. He has also led children's choirs, youth choirs and larger mixed adult choirs including the Birmingham Singers, Stone Choral Society and the Staffordshire Youth Choir.

Nick Thorpe is currently the director of Newstead Abbey Singers, an accomplished chamber choir and Southwell Choral Society. Nick has a wealth of choral conducting experience and works in three primary schools with children from three years old upwards. As a long standing member of abcd he has attended over twenty conventions learning from many of the major names in the British and international choral scene. He has a wide knowledge of repertoire and has premièred and commissioned new works. He is senior lay clerk in Southwell Minster Choir.

abcd (Association of British Choral Directors) is the only UK organisation devoted entirely to those leading choral music, both amateur and professional, providing opportunities for the development of all those leading singing, in any environment. It runs courses and seminars and publishes the journal, Mastersinger. It works closely with other national organisations and is a Sing Up Flagship for 2008-10.
