WILL DAWES

Will Dawes is Conductor of Bath Choral Society, Conductor of Henley Choral Society, Director of Ensemble 45, Chorusmaster for Ludus Baroque and Director of Music at the church of St Mary Magdalen, Oxford. Will studied music at the University of Edinburgh and then Choral Conducting and Voice at the Royal Academy of Music under Patrick Russill, Paul Brough and David Lowe. He was awarded the Thomas Armstrong Prize for Choral Direction.

Will's work with Henley Choral Society has seen performances ranging from the *St John Passion* (Bach) to *The Company of Heaven* (Britten), the latter hailed as 'a musical experience as exciting as you'd get at any major London venue'. He prepares Ludus Baroque for their performances of the great works by Handel and Bach, as well as for recordings on the Delphian label. His work with Ensemble 45 (and its Edinburgh-based predecessor Edinburgh Camerata) has included national premieres of works by Pärt, Penderecki, Rautavaara and Whitacre. Will performs around the world as a member of internationally acclaimed and multiple-Grammy-nominated vocal ensemble Stile Antico and has appeared as part of the Gabrieli Consort, Collegium Vocale Gent and Polyphony.

DAVID SMITH

Henley Choral Society's regular accompanist, David Smith graduated with distinction from the Royal Academy of Music and was awarded the Shinn Junior Fellowship. David is in great demand as a collaborator with many of the leading singers of his generation, as well as established artists. A review of Henley Choral Society's Summer 2012 concert commented: 'David Smith's contribution as piano accompanist was nothing short of miraculous.'

VERDI REQUIEM

The Verdi *Requiem* (1874) is an undisputed masterpiece. Verdi drew on all his operatic experience to create a work for four soloists, double choir and orchestra which contrasts episodes of high drama with moments of great tenderness. This thrilling and awe-inspiring epic runs the gamut of human emotions from the fortissimo eruptions of the Dies Irae, through the dancing energy of the Sanctus to the poignant conclusion.
