Directions, transport and parking

Peel Hall is situated on the A6, 10 minutes from Manchester city centre towards Eccles, Bolton, Wigan.

Public Transport

Bus nos 8, 12, 26, 32, 37, 36 stop opposite Peel Hall (ask for The Crescent, Salford University).

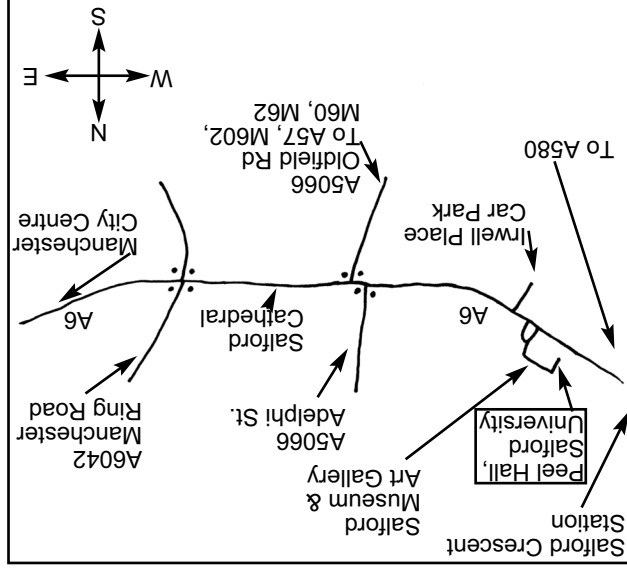
Trains from Manchester Victoria Station call at Salford Crescent Station, 5 minutes walk from Peel Hall.

Parking

Free parking in Salford University Irwell Place Car Park on the opposite side of the A6 (5 minutes walk). There is also some parking directly outside Peel Hall, including disabled spaces, but charges apply here.

Disabled Access

There is a flight of steps to get into the building, but access can be provided for wheelchairs at the rear of the building with prior notice. The Hall itself has raked lecture theatre-type seating, but wheelchairs can be accommodated. **If you need wheelchair access, please make this clear on the booking form.**



Matthew Hamilton is in demand as a conductor of choral ensembles throughout the UK. He appears frequently with groups such as BBC Singers, London Symphony Chorus, BBC Symphony Chorus and CBSO Chorus, and has worked with youth and student choirs including the National Youth Choir, Hallé Youth Choir, Royal College of Music Chorus, and Three Choirs Festival Youth Choir. He has recently been appointed to the choral department at London Symphony Orchestra, and is Musical Director of Reading Bach Choir, Keele Bach Choir and Salford Choral Society.

Roderick Barrand, Accompanist, has been on the staff of the RNCM since 1979. He has performed with many leading singers and instrumentalists, has recorded for Hyperion Records, and has broadcast on BBC 3, local radio and television. Roderick has been official accompanist to Salford Choral Society since 1985, and has appeared as concerto soloist with Sale Chamber Orchestra and the Northern Chamber Orchestra.

Salford Symphony Orchestra was originally founded in 1947 and Sir John Barbirolli was the orchestra's President for some years. After many successful years, the orchestra disbanded in 1985, but following requests from the Salford public and musicians, was re-formed in 1995. The Orchestra aims to provide local people with interesting programmes and also offers platform opportunities for talented musicians (amateur and professional), performing four concerts a year at Peel Hall at the University of Salford.
